Congratulations to Mr Cheung and his wife Aki:


We are delighted to share the news that last night Mr Cheung and his wife welcomed baby 'Elly' into the world!

Yesterday the HK Govt and EDB announced that in light of the current situation with Covid-19 (coronavirus) management strategies, schools would remain closed until a provisional date of Monday 16th March. All of us share the feelings of frustration and anxiety that this brings but as the whole of the Hong Kong community is involved we will do our share to make sure our students are happy, engaged

and learning in the coming weeks.



It is also important to thank the JIS staff as they are working very hard to connect individually with students and families – often from early morning (7 a.m.) until late in to the evenings (10pm) with family breaks in between. Of course the staff would rather be at 4663 Tai Po Road with the children but this cannot happen for a few more weeks, so we continue to find the best ways to engage with the children's learning. Thank you for the messages of support and gratitude that have been sent in to the school office – we have passed them on to staff.

Issues addressed by some JIS community members in recent requests to school:

Currently, our school year will continue as planned, using our published calendar, we do not have plans to extend or alter holiday periods. Our staff are doing their best to continue a curriculum that is accessible to those JIS students who are engaging with them. The school year is carrying on.

The school fees issue is circulating in the HK media and some of our parents have contacted school. Please let me clarify a few things for everyone. As a not for profit business JIS manages school fees to support the students and their education. We keep our fees as competitive as possible and any minimum profit made is given back to the students for their educational resources and to improve school staffing. School fees are committed for the closure period to pay salaries, utility bills and ongoing maintenance work. There is hence no scope to refund as the closure situation is not the fault of the school or the staff. They continue to work hard to support the students in the best ways they can. Many thanks for your understanding.

Around school: things are growing – is spring here? Let's hope so.

We've started getting some of the plants organized for the green wall garden area at the back of the school. If you have an opportunity to start growing a plant with your child(ren) please encourage them and when they return to school we can put it in the garden.

Tomato soup coming for P1!

Thursday and Friday next week (20th and 21st February)

On Thursday and Friday next week, all staff will be involved in Professional Development days.
